# 2021 Dane County Youth Assessment High School Demographic Report – Family Income by Selected Items

Every three years, youth in grades 7-12 complete the DCYA, survey that captures their opinions, concerns, behaviors, attitudes, and experiences on a range of topics. The DCYA is a collaborative effort led by the Dane County Youth Commission in partnership with the United Way of Dane County, Public Health Madison & Dane County, the City of Madison, and county school districts.

This particular report is one of a series of demographic reports the Dane County Youth Commission is publishing that look closely at certain groups of youth by selected items from the 2021 DCYA. Different groups of youth often have systematically different perspectives and experiences. Therefore, we believe it is important to take a closer look at how subpopulations of students may respond differently to various topics on the 2021 DCYA. The five demographic reports will cover race, gender identification, sexual orientation, and family income.

# Survey Development and Administration

Survey development is led by K12 Associates, LLC and a committee of educators, public health professionals, project funders, and parent representatives. The survey includes questions about protective and risk behaviors across contexts of school, peer relations, family, and community. The 2021 DCYA includes new questions on emerging youth issues while retaining important questions from past surveys to measure trends. The survey includes items from the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Youth Risk Behavior Survey and other national surveys to allow for comparisons to youth in the U.S. and in Wisconsin. Extensive efforts are made to ensure that questions are clear and understandable. A Spanish version is available.

Between January 15 and April 15 2021, middle and high school students took the DCYA across nineteen public school districts and one private high school. Student participation is voluntary and anonymous. Parents are notified at least four weeks in advance of survey administration, may review the survey at their school district office, and may opt their child out of participating.

# Administration During the COVID-19 Pandemic

The 2021 DCYA was administered during the COVID-19 pandemic, at a time when students were more likely to be attending school virtually as opposed to in-person. In fact, 97% of students surveyed spent the majority of this school year attending classes virtually.

Not surprisingly, this had a dramatic impact on certain student behaviors and ultimately how we present the data in this report. For example, some antisocial behaviors (like bullying) that usually take place at school were down considerably. Also, behaviors that typically involve students congregating or socializing face-to-face (like alcohol use or sexual behavior) were down as well. Unfortunately, emotional health topics related to stress and worry (struggling with homework, depression) were higher. It is impossible to know for sure the degree to which certain results are attributable to the COVID pandemic. However, we should be careful in interpreting these 2021 results as the beginning of new trends.

# Data Analysis and Reports

School districts attempt to survey all 7th-12th graders, with most districts capturing over 80% of students. Due to the constraints of remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic, two districts only surveyed a portion of their student population. The students surveyed in these districts were weighted so that race, gender and school size were at proper proportions commensurate with typical survey participation for their respective districts. The results of student responses to survey questions are presented as percentages of the *weighted number* for each item.

Behavioral risk surveys using self-report methodology are widely used and have been proven to be valid and reliable. The large number of participants in the DCYA, the fact that results are in line with national trends, and the consistency in findings over time supports the validity of the DCYA. While the survey is available at school district offices for public review prior to its administration, distribution is restricted until after it is administered in order to preserve the integrity of student responses. As mentioned above, this report provides an overview of survey findings. A complete set of data tables of youth responses to each question by demographic cohorts are posted on the Dane County Youth Commission website.

Ongoing analyses by research partners will yield additional information about Dane County youth including national and state comparisons, trends over time, and factors influencing youth behavior. These reports will be posted on the Youth Commission website as they become available.

# Using This Report

This report looks at 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students' perceived family income by selected questions on the 2021 Dane County Youth Assessment (DCYA-2021). Perceived family income for each student was calculated by combining their responses to three questions:

- 15. How would you describe your family's current financial situation?
- 103. Do you get free or reduced fees lunch at school?
- 104. If the school didn't provide lunch or breakfast, most days, I wouldn't have any food at all.


The combined responses to these questions were averaged to create a single response, and across all students 4 levels of responses were created: % of Lowest Income, % of Lower Income, % of Middle Income and % of Higher Income. The percentage of high school students at each level is shown below.

#### Estimated Family Income

The tables in this report are all constructed in the same manner. There are four subgroups: 1) % of Lowest Income 2) % of Lower Income 3) % of Middle Income and 4) % of Higher Income. Every table has a column for each subgroup and a column for all 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders (labeled % of All 9th-12th Grade) on DCYA-2021. Each column shows how that group or subgroup responded to the selected question.

In the example below, 48% of students whose family was in the Middle Income range volunteered and 52% did not. For all 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students 50% volunteered and 50% did not. Please note: in the tables in this report an empty cell indicates 0 and a cell with 0% indicates <1.
